in place, and it causes homelessness. ReAnna had a perfect storm of events, that she had no foundation to withstand. Trouble started in a bad relationship. When he found out that she was pregnant, he got

mad, denied that it was his or even true. He became verbally and physically abusive. At the same time, a close aunt was dying of a disease, she lost her housing, her boyfriend was cheating and he would harass her at work and school. ReAnna said, "There was so much stress, depression, jealously, anxiety. I started failing as a mom. I was just letting abuse happen to me and my kids. But I kept fighting for him to come back; I thought I really loved him. I just hoped for the best and that he could change. I watched my mom go through the same things with me. I didn't want to put my kids through it." In that vacuum, the

boyfriend introduced a new, common seduction, illegal prescription pain pills. It was the supposed solution to relieve the stress and save the relationship. In a short while, she said, "I got sick from the pills: diarrhea, vomiting, hot flashes, anger. Someone said (a street drug) would fix the problem, but coming down was way worse. Then, I didn't want to get out of bed, tried to commit suicide, had no self-worth. I just left, felt scared, someone wanted to hurt me. I didn't go home and I lost my kids."

Samaritan Inn was there to pick up the pieces. ReAnna needed to learn to live without dependency on drugs, bad relationships or even herself. She needed time to make that transition. She said, "I was used to being wild. Now, I like the structure and rules. It keeps

## **A Progress Report**

The photo above was taken from within the new Samaritan Inn commercial kitchen. The view is through the food serving window, looking into the combination Dining Room, Dayroom and Chapel. In the back, there are the Baggage Storage room, restrooms and showers. On the second floor above, construction is being done on a dormitory, restrooms, showers, laundry, storage and a supervisor's room. The ceilings in every room in all three buildings have been opened up for a fire sprinkler system to be installed. The windows being replaced have been installed. All the remodel framing is complete. The plumber and electrician are on the job site.

Progress on this project is on schedule. The low bidder is General Interiors Construction. Their bid came in very close to the architect's estimate of costs. They came highly recommended, and they are working with us through each step. Changes have been made for efficiency. This project is to open the doors to a fully functional operation, then in the future work on the units not being fully converted, one area at a time.

Donor support and grants have provided the Mission with the financial means to complete this project as it was designed. Thank you for your support to have a larger, better equipped shelter for homeless women and children. Things in life do not always go according to plan, either in our personal lives (thus the need for this shelter) or in remodeling old, unoccupied buildings. As of this writing, opening day is still scheduled for sometime in May, 2015. There is no doubt that we will be able to receive an occupancy permit; however, we have encountered unforeseen expenses.
